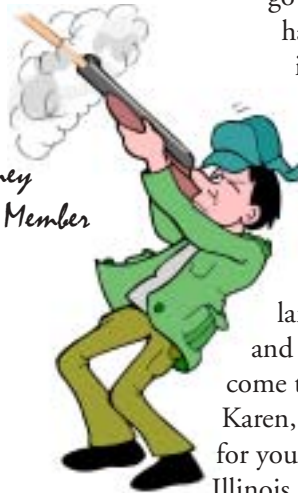

The chuck wagon provided all the shooters with plenty of grub for lunch after shooting 100 rounds of clays, too.

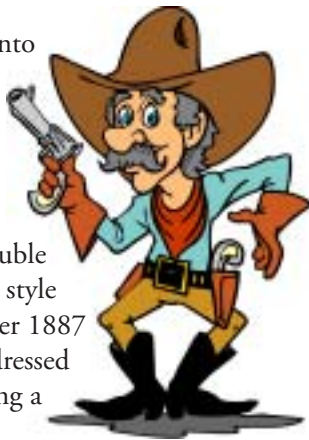

Youth Pheasant Hunt Program

The St Charles Sportsman's Club (SCSC) will sponsor a youth hunt on the leased hunting area for up to 40 young hunters under the age of 19. The youth pheasant hunt is being planned for the Saturday after Veterans Day, November 12th with a day of practice shooting planned for Sunday November 6th at the St. Charles Sportsmen's Club.

Any youth who is a son or daughter, grandson or granddaughter, niece or nephew of a current member of the SCSC, 18 years old or younger, **who has successfully completed the hunter safety program and has a valid Illinois hunting license is eligible to participate in the SCSC Youth Pheasant Hunt Program.**

The program is free to the youth. The SCSC will provide the pheasants, food for the luncheon cookout, and targets and shells for the practice shooting.

Pre-registration is required to determine the number of youth interested in the program. A sign-up sheet will be set up at the club by October 1st and registration will be closed on October 31st. If the program is over subscribed, a lottery will be held to determine the 40 youth eligible to hunt this year. Youth who are accepted into the program will be called right after the registration is closed and given the information about the times and particulars of the practice shoot and the hunt.

On the day of the hunt the pre-hunt activities will include registration, logging in the hunting license numbers, a brief review of hunting safety rules, and a hunting dog demonstration.

After the pre-hunt activities are completed the first group of twenty youth hunters will be allowed into the field. **Each youth hunter must have a non-shooting sponsor walking behind the youth hunter, monitoring safety and the hunt.** All efforts will be made to make sure each youth has an opportunity to have a shot at a bird, and each youth may take up to two birds. After the first group completes their sweep through the field, approximately two hours, the SCSC will plant more birds in preparation for the second group.

When the first group returns, hot dogs and hamburgers will be cooked for lunch and a question and answer period. The youth may have new questions after their first experience in the field. This is also the time the log is updated with birds taken and birds are tagged.

It takes only one stray bullet that leaves the confines of the club and only one or two people who don't believe in following the rules to take away the privileges of the rest of the responsible members. Please don't let that happen. Be aware of what your neighbor is doing on the range.
